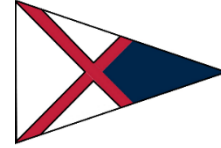


**CCV RACING
TUNE - UP RACES
Sunday, April 2, 2023**



The first chance to get out and stretch our racing legs after a long winter nap. The intent is to do two short races, weather permitting. Courses will consist of government marks in the Harbor.

ENTRIES: Enter online <http://ccvracing.us/race-registration/> All boats, whether CCVR members or not, are welcome to come and race. Boats are requested to fly their class flags.

ENTRY FEE: None (It doesn't get any better than that!)

EQUIPMENT: All boats must meet US Sailing's "Nearshore" Safety Equipment Requirements.

RULES: The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2021-2024 and the CCVR General Sailing Instructions.

STARTING LINE: Between the orange flag on the RC boat and CCVR Mark A (Harbor). This is Day Beacon R "4" outside the mouth of the Hampton River.

FINISH LINE: First Race: CCVR Mark A and blue flag on RC boat.
Second Race: either CCV Mark A or off the HYC Dock (see course board).

CONCEPT AND COURSES: The intent is to do two short races. Courses will use CCVR racing marks listed on the race committee boat's course board per CCVR General Sailing Instructions.

STARTING SIGNALS: RRS 26 will be used with an Attention Signal consisting of a series of short sounds sounded approximately five (5) minutes before the warning signal for each race. The Warning Signal for the first race is scheduled for 1100.

ORDER of STARTS:

<u>CLASS</u>	<u>FLAG</u>
PHRF Non-Spin / Cruising, ORC Cruiser (combined)	#5 pennant
PHRF Spinnaker A, B/C (combined)	#9 pennant

SCORING: An Order of Finish sheet will be posted at the Hampton Yacht Club Lounge as soon as possible after the last boat finishes.

AWARDS: None, other than the enjoyment of spirited, friendly competition.
